### IQAC <u>Students' Feedback 2019-20</u>

This is the **summary** of the students' feedback – primarily from <u>outgoing</u> <u>UG & PG students</u> – for the academic year 2019-20.

**Objective of the feedback:** The primary objective of this comprehensive exercise with fourteen leading questions is to get students' opinions and suggestions regarding a wide range of teaching and mentoring variables including courses, syllabi, teachers' performance and communication in class, evaluation processes, internship/field work, institutional opportunities and growth, academic follow-up, illustrations and examples, motivation and overall experience that would be fundamental to any teaching-learning institution's pathway towards self-reflection and corrective measures and procedures.

<u>Methodology</u> of the feedback system: Google Forms were sent to the registered emails of primarily <u>all outgoing undergraduate and postgraduate students</u> for the year 2019-20.

The Google Forms were received <u>anonymously</u> with full non-disclosure; <u>complete secrecy and confidentiality</u> were maintained with both data in the raw and data-analysis/narrative that are given below.

Space for <u>individual comments</u> were available and have been incorporated as such and as much as is feasible below.

<u>Structure</u> of the Students' Feedback: This feedback system comprises <u>fourteen parameters</u> ranging across syllabi, pedagogy, teachers' evaluation and institutional support among many others including space for individual comments and suggestions/complaints.

Interaction with students were also done throughout the academic year including online during the major part of the Covid-19-induced lockdown so that teachers/departments were kept abreast with their wants/lacks and positive constructive suggestions.

**Observation**: Detailed department/school wise feedback was made available to heads/principals of departments/schools so that microcorrections and redressal may take place at various fora. Individual members of the faculty were also asked to investigate areas that require attention and strengthening.

**Overall Students' Experience Indicator:** (Please see #14 below)

A clear majority of the students have expressed satisfaction and happiness with their academic and overall experience at Visva-Bharati: interaction with teachers and their performance in pedagogical discourses in and outside classroom/laboratories, the syllabi and course-contents, job opportunities and learning outcomes, mentoring and individual growth, institutional support and encouragement, and the like.

Areas in which students think that there is scope for improvement or inclusion/rejection have been noted with due diligence and the resultant analysed data have been made available across the university at department, institute and administrative levels for study, scrutiny and positive corrective action at the earliest.

## Students' Feedback Report

### Range of Student-Respondents

<u>1. 87.4% of the student-respondents were from the UG (45.2%) and PG (42.2%) courses of study;</u>

2. 53.6% were male students while 46.8% were female students.

**1.** How much of the syllabus was covered in class during the last semester?

55.9% of the students have confirmed that 85-100% of the syllabus was covered by academic departments at Visva-Bharati during the January-June 2020 semester while 30.6% of students say that 70-84% of the same syllabi were covered across all departments/schools and courses of study.

This constitutes for an overwhelming majority – 86% – of students stating that 70-100% of the syllabi was covered during the year.

Kindly note that a large part of the semester – mid-March 2020 onwards – coincides with the Covid-19 lockdown; as most courses and semester teaching pick up momentum towards the end of the semester, this figure is very respectable as Visva-Bharati quickly and successfully moved into the Work-from-Home mode and classes were held online across various platforms and fora.

### 2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

While 49.4% have judged teachers to have prepared 'thoroughly' for classroom/online academic activity, 48.7% have marked teachers as having 'satisfactorily' prepared for the classes and lectures/demonstrations.

These two positive positions account for a whopping 98.1% of responses.

#### 3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?

70.8% of respondents agree that their teachers were 'always effective' while 15.9% consider them to be 'sometimes effective' in communicating with the students in classroom and other sites of pedagogical dissemination.

As noted earlier, the severe disruption in and movement away from classroom teaching towards online modes and methodology of pedagogy may have been responsible for what the university thinks could have been a much better set of figures.

But, keeping within the limited opportunity and internet and other services considered in our decidedly rural setting, the figures are very decent and something of which the entire Visva-Bharati fraternity is proud of.

**4.** The teachers' approach to teaching can best be described as 37.5% of students think that the teachers' approach to teaching is 'excellent' while 40.6% think that they are 'very good'; 21.1% consider teachers approach to academics as 'good'.

### 5. Fairness of evaluation process of teachers

61.4% of student respondents think that teachers are 'always fair' in their evaluation while 30.6% think that they are 'usually fair' in student-evaluation practices.

Thus, 92% of respondents have stated that the process of evaluation at Visva-Bharati is fair, legitimate, honest and transparent.





### **6.** Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?

47.8% of students say that the teachers discussed their assignments and other academic activities with them 'every time' while 32.3% say that the teachers 'usually' discussed the same with them.

The online process of internal assignments and lack of internet service at that time at both teacher-student end may have been responsible for some teachers not being able to contact the students and vice-versa.

## **7.** The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, students exchange and field visit opportunities for students

This response elicited a very mixed response unlike the earlier ones with 31.5% of students saying that the university 'regularly' took proactive interest in promoting exchanges and field-trips while 27.4% and 18.5% registered that the institution 'sometimes' and 'often' showed interest respectively regarding the question as proposed above.

This is one area that the university needs to investigate actively and resolve at the earliest by instituting mutual collaborations and MoUs with other academic establishments in India and abroad.

  - **8.** The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth

52.5% and 27% of student respondents consider Visva-Bharati as 'very well' and 'significantly' engendering cognitive, social and emotional growth above and beyond the academic and pedagogical purported practices of academic institutions.

These two positions bring the data close to 80% of respondents keeping their faith in the institution acting as a mentor and father-

figure in the truest possible form even (we would say: especially) during the dark days of the Covid-19 lockdown and academic and social deprivations that followed.

**9.** The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and growth

In direct continuation of the earlier matrix, 46.8% and 35.8% of students who have responded to the feedback respectively 'agree' and 'strongly agree' that Visva-Bharati provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.

This is part of the mentoring facility where the institution does not stifle individual freedom and personality but fosters and encourages independent thinking and rational progress as academics and individual human beings within a holistic environment.

# **10.** Teachers inform you about your expected competency as well as course and programme outcomes

Over 86% of students polled have agreed positively (49.5% say 'every time' while 36.7% say 'usually') that teachers regularly inform/discuss with them their academic and research competency levels as well as the various course and programme outcomes and learning objectives.

This is part of the teacher-student tutorial system within the traditional continuous internal-assessment system in vogue at Visva-Bharati since the 1980s.

Teachers are keyed-in on student performance/s and are aware of individual strengths and weaknesses which make for more effective pedagogy in classroom-laboratory situations.

# **11.** Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with assigned tasks to you

Almost 82% of student-respondents (47.7% say 'every time' while 34.1% say 'usually') have said that their mentors do necessary follow-up on assigned tasks and routine assignments that are given to them during their semester systems as part of regular assessments as well as class/home work.

**12.** The teachers illustrate the concept through examples and applications

Over 90% of students who responded to the feedback agree with the point in question that teachers illustrate academic and pedagogical concepts through examples and applications in class/laboratory: 60.6% have responded to 'every time' while 30.6% agree with 'usually'.

This is emphatic as part of the semester system was during the lockdown for Covid-19 reasons and thus it vindicates the teachers' devotion towards teaching and students' application towards concepts and themes.

**13.** The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing the right level of challenges

Almost 84% of student-respondents agree that teachers identify students' strength and encourage them by providing the right level of challenges: 51.7% say 'every time' while 32.2% say 'usually'.

This is central to a higher academic institution as students are aware of their strengths and weaknesses and ties up with #10 above.

### **14.** Your overall academic experience

The overall experience – academic and pedagogic milieu in classrooms, laboratories, research facilities as well as at work-and-teach-from-home conditions during the Covid-19 induces lockdown – is as follows:

- (a) 22.9% of respondents have said that their academic experience at Visva-Bharati was 'excellent';
- (b) 34.6% have said that their overall experience at the university were 'very good';
- (c) 30% have said that their experience was 'good';
- (d) 11.8% have said that their experience was 'average'; and
- (e) 1.8% have said that their overall experience was 'below average'.
