It has adapted across media—from oil painting and sculpture to photography and digital platforms—yet its core aim persists: to convey the identity and inner character of the subject. Historically rooted and culturally significant, portrait painting continues to serve as a powerful medium for exploring individuality, memory, and representation.

In the era of conceptual art and post-conceptual art natural fibre-based paper making has emerged as a cultural signifier of location, body and identity. Moreover, Book art emerged as an independent form of art practice. This internship will explore these different aspects with specific reference to paper making from natural fibre and book art.
