Experiences on Theatre

- Having keen interest on a new developing research methodology namely Performance as Research (PaR) and Embodied Research, he has been exploring the dynamics of psycho-physical acting following the Manipuri theatre practitioners Late Heisnam Kanhailal and Heisnam Sabitri taking participation in their theatre workshops since 2008. Since 2008, he has worked with Kanhailal and Sabitri on their major productions. He has also worked with Heisnam Tomba, son of Kanhailal-Sabitri on his major productions Keibu-Keioiba, Pi Thadoi, Samnadraba Mami (Disjointed Images), The Hungry Stones based on the story of Rabindranath Tagore of the same name (as translators and backstage musicians) and Meeyamgi Yeknaba, a Manipuri adaptation of Henrik Ibsen's An Enemy of the People (as Dramaturge and Translator).
- He has been part of the theatre community-building project with Kalakshetra Manipur. They have worked on developing the Rampur village in Goalpara district of Assam through theatre.
