Project Title:

Contesting Claims, Conflicting Interests: The Marathas, Siddi of Janjira and the European Merchant Warriors in the Konkan Littoral (1659-1759)

Report of the Work Done

Objective of the Project:

- To study the manifestation of maritime sovereignty and related claims in the Konkan waters based on the perception of the sea of the Europeans as well as the native political entities.
- 2. To examine the conflict of interests, viz. political, economic, geographical or strategic, of the various polities in the Konkan littoral during the proposed period.
- 3. Analyzing the geopolitical interactions between various polities of the Konkan and assess the role of European Companies in the local conflicts.
- 4. To find out, in what ways did technological disparity influence the outcome of the conflict and cooperation on the Konkan littoral.
- 5. To briefly outline the main elements of the naval warfare with special reference to the Maratha navy.

Summary of the Findings: (Executive Summary: 500 words)

The arrival of the Europeans in the Indian Ocean region established direct contact between Western Europe and maritime Asia, ushering in periods of commercial, cultural, artistic, and technological exchange. While in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries, the main focus of the Europeans largely remained on trade and monopolies, in later years, their interactions and activities became more varied and encompassed a range of issues within the overall domain

of maritime history. The Europeans violently competed with each other and with native merchants for trade monopoly. They coerced native shipping on the strength of their navies, backed by their claim of sovereignty over the sea, which gave rise to contested claims over the sea and its usage in the Indian surroundings. The present study has examined the following:

- (i) Contestations: Causes and manifestations; Maratha tactical ingenuity in Euro-Maratha naval contests
- (ii) Collaborations: Aspects of diplomacy; role of the Europeans in local conflicts

The study establishes that the urge for trade control, command of the sea, and navigation were the most fundamental causes of the contestations. While intra-European conflict was mostly for trading settlements and monopolization of commodities, Euro-Indian contestations arose primarily because of purported European sovereign claims over the sea articulated through their navies and navigational passes. The Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb resorted to military means to control the aggressive activities of the Europeans. In 1690, his admiral, the Siddi of Janjira, successfully carried out a naval blockade of Bombay, the headquarters of the English EIC. Aurangzeb subsequently directed the European Trading Companies to ensure the security of the sea route and the ships on the Surat-Mecca route. On the other hand, Shivaji had developed a sea-going flotilla to project Maratha power in the Konkan littoral. Shivaji also fortified the Maratha coast and a couple of offshore rocks. Furthermore, like the Europeans, Shivaji started issuing navigational passes and made it compulsory for all to purchase them.

The study also reveals that diplomatic manoeuvres played a crucial part in maritime interactions alongside naval conflicts. Trade and profit remained the primary concern of the

Europeans. Therefore, they would send envoys and emissaries to native courts to obtain favourable terms and other trade privileges. At times, they collaborated with their allies against their adversaries. The study further divulges that on many occasions, the Europeans would take up the role of arbiters in local conflicts. A peaceful coast and hinterland facilitated trade and commerce. On the other hand, the study also finds that during the reign of Shivaji, the Maratha navy refrained from engaging in any severe or long-drawn conflict with the Europeans. Shivaji's navy mostly acted as a deterrent and was also used as a tool to gain political or economic gains vis-à-vis the Europeans. During the eighteenth century, however, under the command of Maratha Admiral Kanhoji Angre, the Maratha navy started giving offence to the Europeans and seriously challenged them in the Konkan waters. The study ends with a general appreciation of the naval strategy and tactics used by the Marathas to come to grips with their opponents.

Memberships of Academic/Professional Bodies:

The comprehensive nature of this project adds to its interdisciplinary relevance. It is a detailed study of the Konkan littoral and its geomorphology. It also considered the formulation of strategy and tactics used during the naval engagements concerning the location of the coastal forts and the pattern of tidal waters. Moreover, the role of technology (military and shipbuilding), influencing the outcome of such conflicts, was also critically analyzed. Realizing the need for more collaborations and an interdisciplinary approach to the Project Work, the Principal Investigator reached out to other institutions and departments. In July 2016, the PI, on his own, visited the NHO (National Hydrographic Office) located at Dehradun (Uttrakhand). The NHO is a government body and is the nodal agency for hydrographic surveys and nautical charting. The PI's visit to NHO has been quite fruitful as he could interact with the cartographers and get to understand more about the hydrographic features of the Konkan coast. The PI also acquired life membership in academic bodies like (a) The Indian History Congress and (b) The Indian National Cartographic Association (INCA) in the year 2016. The PI was nominated as an Executive Committee Member of the INCA in 2017.

Contribution to the society:

Though this study restricts itself to the geopolitics of the Konkan littoral, it has also explored and enriched our international understanding of the area in the period under review. While exploring the impact of the European arrival in the Indian Ocean world and the Arabian Sea

upon the political economy of the Afro-Asian systems, it was seen that the political authorities in the Konkan littoral emulated the way the Europeans projected and implemented the concept of maritime sovereignty. Apart from studying the salient features of the Maratha navy, the diplomatic manoeuvres for the control of the Konkan, which saw the forging of alliances (of convenience) involving the European powers and the local rulers, have also been delineated.
