**Memorandum of Understanding
Between
Yunnan Minzu University, China
and
Visva-Bharati University, India**

Yunnan Minzu University (hereinafter called YMU) and Visva-Bharati University (hereinafter called VBU) establish hereby a formal understanding of cooperation and friendship which is intended to further academic objectives of each institution and to promote better understanding between the faculty and students of YMU and the faculty and students of VBU. Under this Memorandum of Understanding, the two institutions will proceed to implement the following endeavors and exchanges of materials and personnel.

Areas of Cooperation

Cooperation shall be carried out, subject to availability of funds and approval of the competent authority of YMU and VBU, through such activities or programmes as:

1. Exchange of faculty members

1.1 Both two institutions will accept 1-2 faculty members once a year for at most 30 days to the opposite institution. Each side can provide the faculty members with accommodation if they have related program. If not, the faculty members should manage the accommodation themselves. The faculty member will manage the air tickets and food themselves. During the faculty members stay in other university, they can have lectures and workshops and Chinese corner or Bengali corner, or Hindi corner for free.

1.2 YMU can invite Bengali teachers and Hindi teachers from VBU to be foreign teachers cum researchers. They will stay at YMU for one/ two semesters at least. VBU will provide the CV of the teachers beforehand. YMU will provide free

hospitality(lodging and fooding) and other benefits as per the rule of YMU.

1.3 If VBU needs Chinese teachers to teach Chinese in VBU , YMU will apply for Chinese teachers or volunteers(who have master's degree) with the NOCFL on behalf of VBU. They will stay at VBU for 3-4 months. VBU will provide free accommodation.

1.4 VBU can invite Taiji teachers from YMU to be foreign teachers cum researchers. YMU will provide the CV of the teachers beforehand. VBU will provide free accommodation and other benefits as per the rule of VBU.

2. Exchange of students

VBU will accept the students of Bengali major students or Hindi major students from YMU for one year to study in VBU . The students from YMU will pay for the fees for the credits, the travel, accommodation and food. Both sides should agree with the teaching curriculum before the arrival of the students.

3. Joint research activities
4. Participation in seminars and academic meetings
5. Exchange of academic materials and other information
6. Special short-term academic programmes
7. Exchange of Administrative Managers/Coordinators
8. Joint cultural Programmes

The terms of such mutual cooperation and necessary budget for each specific programme and activity that is implemented under the terms of this MoU shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to the initiation of the particular programme or activity and the terms of such programme shall be negotiated on an annual basis.

Scope of the Cooperation

The areas of cooperation include, subject to mutual consent, any Programme offered at either university as felt desirable and feasible on either side and that both sides feel can contribute to fostering and development of cooperative relationships between the two universities.

The assistance to be provided by each of the contracting parties will be teaching, research, exchange of faculty and students, and staff development, etc. as deemed beneficial by the two institutions.

The cooperation will be focused on the following fields of study initially;

1. The teaching of Hindi or Bengali to the Chinese students, such as languages and

literature.

2. The teaching of Chinese to Indian students.
3. The study of Indian and Chinese cultures.
4. The teaching of Taiji to Indian students.

It is implied that the two institutions will subscribe to the principle of equal opportunities and will not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, ethnicity, religion or national origin. Both the institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither institution shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students which would violate the principles of non discrimination.

The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) shall remain in force for a period of three years from the date it is signed by the appropriate officials of the two universities. It may further be extended or amended with the written agreement of both parties. This MoU may be terminated by either party subject to the delivery of six months advance notice, in writing.

Both parties will take care of medical / accidental insurances as applicable of their own members.

No damages can be claimed by either of the party for non-fulfilment of conditions of memorandum of understanding.

Both parties understand that all financial arrangements will have to be negotiated and will depend on the availability of funds.

This Memorandum of Agreement (hereafter referred to as the MOA) seeks to promote the mutual understanding and cooperation between the Shanghai Library and Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati, and both parties agree on the following terms:

1. Principle of Cooperation

In the spirit of friendship, equality, mutual benefit and development, both parties agree to carry out cooperation and exchange as follows:

2. Scope of Cooperation

1) Book Donation - 'Window of Shanghai'

- a) In the first year of the MOA, the Shanghai Library will deliver 500 copies of books selected from the "Window of Shanghai" booklist by the staff of Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati as the initial 'Window of Shanghai' donation, which will become the property of Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati. From the second year, a further donation of 100 books per year selected from the "Window of Shanghai" booklist by the staff of Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati will be delivered by the Shanghai Library as supplement to the 'Window of Shanghai' collection.
- b) The Shanghai Library will be responsible for the expenses of the procurement, packing, delivery and/or tariff duties that may be charged.
- c) The 'Window of Shanghai' Collection will be housed and displayed in/on separate stack within Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati where it will be prominently labelled and easily identifiable.
- d) Appropriate signage will be designed by Cheena Bhavana

Library, Visva Bharati to promote the 'Window of Shanghai' Collection.

- e) A bookplate will be inserted into each book, and/or mark the book as belonging to the 'Window of Shanghai' in the catalogue record to acknowledge the donation.
- f) Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati will also organise exhibitions, media coverage, events or other means to expand the awareness of the 'Window of Shanghai' Collection among the local public.
- g) The resources will be available for browsing and/or lending at no charge to all Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati patrons upon presentation of their Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati membership cards.
- h) Collection items will not be dispersed throughout other collections or branch libraries in Central Library and other sectional libraries of Visva Bharati Library Network although customers from branch libraries may borrow items from the Collection. After such items are returned they will be shelved back on their designated shelves in the location of Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati.
- i) All items in the 'Window of Shanghai' Collection will be fully catalogued to international standards and accessible on the online catalogue of Visva Bharati Library Network. The Shanghai Library will offer the bibliographic records of the donated books to Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati if required.
- j) The Collection will be subject to normal collection management practices of Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati in terms of issuing, extended loans, processing, mending and de-selection.
- k) Final responsibility for the collection remains with Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati whose Collection Development

Team will manage it. The Collection Development Librarian / in-charge, Cheena Bhavana Library will assume responsibility for any liaison with a representative of the Shanghai Library regarding the content of the 'Window of Shanghai' Collection.

- 1) Cheena Bhavana Library, Visva Bharati will supply the Shanghai Library with collection usage statistics; and will answer the regular questionnaire survey raised by the Shanghai Library if required.

2) Exchange of Library Resources

- a) Along with the 'Window of Shanghai' donation program, both parties could regularly exchange their library resources. Resources for exchange could be duplicates withdrawn from the library's holding, or the latest publications.
- b) The providing party shall be responsible for the expenses of the procurement, packing, delivery and/or tariff duties that may be charged.

3) Exchange and Cooperation

- a) Both parties agree to develop exchange and cooperation projects on library management, digital library, bibliography and database compilation, inter-library loans, reference consultation, preservation and restoration of library materials, web-based services and other projects as agreed. Any reports or research outcomes will be presented in writing to each organization at the conclusion of the project.
- b) Both parties could jointly hold exhibitions in accordance with the individual and specific requirements of each party. The duration of the exhibition will be established by consultation. Details regarding any exhibition, including expenses will be negotiated and agreed to by both parties prior to

implementation.

4) **Publicity and Sponsorship**

Both parties will seek the agreement of the other party for any publicity and/or sponsorship arrangements that either party may wish to seek in respect to any aspect of the MOA, including the book donation, exchange of library resources, staff exchange and other exchange and cooperation projects.

3. **Language and Validity**

- 1) The MOA shall take effect from the date of its execution by the duly authorized representatives of the parties and shall remain valid until 03/November/2019.
- 2) If neither cooperative party informs the other party of its intention to terminate the MOA within six months before the expiry, this MOA shall be automatically extended for another 03 Years (2022/11).
- 3) The MOA shall be written in English and Chinese and each party shall hold one copy of each version, both/all texts being of equal authenticity. In the event of any discrepancy, the English version shall prevail.

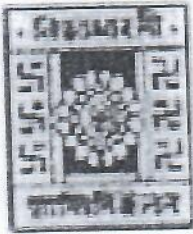

MEMORADUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN
VISVA-BHARATI UNIVERSITY
SANTINIKETAN, BIRBHUM, WEST-BENGAL, INDIA
AND
YUNNAN UNIVERSITY,
KUNMING, YUNNAN, CHINA



In accordance with a mutual desire to promote joint interests, Visva-Bharati University and Yunnan University have agreed to enter into the following agreement of mutual co-operation.

Both Visva-Bharati University and Yunnan University will encourage contact and cooperation between their own faculty members, departments and other affiliated institutes and programs. This agreement shall enable the two universities to enter into working relationships with each another, subject to the following provisions:

Article 1 Visva-Bharati University shall enter into co-operative arrangements with Yunnan University in fields of research, teaching and collaboration to be agreed upon. Activities would include but not be restricted to:

- 1.1 Joint research activities developed through the research linkages of individual professors;
- 1.2 Exchange of faculty members, graduate students and undergraduate students for research and study;
- 1.3 Exchange of information in fields of interest to both the two universities;
- 1.4 Development of professional and continuing education courses and programs to benefit students and faculty in two universities;
- 1.5 Exchange of scholars for lectures, talks, conferences, colloquia, symposia and sharing experiences.

Article 2 The conduct of joint activities, the conditions for utilizing the results achieved, and arrangements for specific visits and exchanges as well as other forms of co-operation will be negotiated for each specific case.

Article 3 The two universities agree that all financial arrangements will have to be negotiated and will depend on the availability of funds.

Article 4 Where practical, the two universities will endeavour to involve its partner institution in its international activities on a preferred basis.

Article 5 It is understood that the two universities subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, ethnicity, religion, or national origin. Both universities shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither institution shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students which would violate

principles of non-discrimination.


Article 6 Each university will support their counterpart to construct People to People Communication Study Center in each university.

Article 7 This agreement will be effective for a period of Five (5) years from the date hereof which may be extended by the mutual consent of the two institutions.

Article 8 Given that this agreement represents a totally voluntary endeavor by both parties, it may be amended by the mutual agreement of both parties or it may be terminated by either upon prior notification in writing to the other party of not less than twelve (12) months. Any termination of this agreement must take into account existing faculty or students' endeavors.

Article 9 IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the agreement is signed in Kolkata, on the _____ of September but in case of any divergence in interpretation, the English text shall prevail.

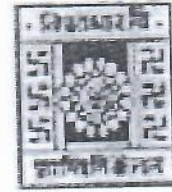

中国云南大学与印度国际大学合作备忘录

为了推进双方共同利益，云南大学和国际大学同意签署以下合作协议。

云南大学和国际大学鼓励两校之间的院系及其它附属机构的项目合作和交流。两校将按协议以下条款规定，确保双方的合作关系：

第一条 国际大学与云南大学就研究、教学和相关合作领域进行合作。活动将包括，但不局限于：

- 1.1 通过教授之间的科研联系开展合作研究活动；
- 1.2 教师和本科生/研究生开展研究和学习交流；
- 1.3 在双方共同感兴趣的领域交换信息；
- 1.4 开展专业及继续教育的课程和项目，使得双方的师生受益；
- 1.5 双方学者在讲座、谈话、会议、座谈会、研讨会等方面交流经验；

第二条 双方开展任何共同的活动、利用项目成果、安排特定的访问交流或开展其他形式的合作需根据具体情况进行商讨。

第三条 双方同意对所有项目资金的使用进行商讨并依靠有效基金。

第四条 双方在合适的时候将优先邀请对方参与其在国际领域的相关活动。

第五条 双方遵守人人机会平等的原则，不分种族、性别、年龄、民族、地区或者国家。双方应在此原则基础上来执行该协议，对学者和学生的交换标准，任何一方不得违背非歧视原则。

第六条 双方支持在对方学校设国际大学-云南大学印中人文交流中心和云南大学—国际大学中印人文交流中心。

第七条 该协议自签署之日起生效，有效期为5年，经双方同意，该协议期限可延长。

第八条 由于该协议代表了双方自愿的原则，因而协议的修改需要经过双方的同意，协议的终止需要由任一方提前12个月书面通知另一方。在终止该协议前，需要考虑到有关师生所付出的努力。

第九条 本协议定于二零一七年九月 日在加尔各答签订，一式两份，每份都用中文和英文两种文字写成，两种文字具有同等效力。在对文本的解释发生分歧时，应以英文文本为准。

Party C: Visva-Bharati University
Address: Santiniketan, Birbhum, West Bengal 731235, India

In order to strengthen the educational exchange and cooperation between China and India, and support Chinese language teaching in India, Through friendly negotiations, Hanban, Peking University of China and Visva-Bharati University of India reach the agreement on the following articles and items.

Article I Rights and Obligations of Party A

1. To appoint a Chinese teaching expert from Party B to work for Party C for one to two months on local Chinese teacher training and teaching of specialized Chinese courses. Party A shall pay the experts on Party A's relevant standards.
2. To send two volunteer Chinese teachers to work for Party C with respect to Chinese language teaching for ten to twelve months.
3. To provide one research fellowship each year for Chinese teachers of Party C to study in China for one month.
4. To provide Party C with four master degree scholarships and four Ph.D degree scholarships each year, and the beneficiaries shall study at Party B under a syllabus negotiated and mutually accepted by Party B and Party C. Each beneficiary needs to sign a contract to guarantee that s/he will work for at least five years on Chinese language teaching in India after graduation.
5. To provide five to eight scholarships to students of Party C to study Chinese in China for one semester or one academic year.
6. To provide funding for the exchanges between Party B and Party C regulated in this agreement.

Article II Rights and Obligations of Party B

1. To select experts under the request and requirement of Party A and Party C and designate them to work for Party C on local Chinese teacher education and teaching of specialized Chinese courses.
2. To provide teaching for teachers of Party C during their stay in China and make accommodation arrangements.
3. To negotiate master and Ph.D courses with Party C for the scholarship

beneficiaries and provide teaching and training.

Article III Rights and Obligations of Party C

1. To organize local Chinese teacher training annually and conduct survey on local Chinese teachers.
2. To provide accommodation for experts from Party B and provide assistance with regard to relevant formalities.
3. To provide volunteer Chinese teachers with formality assistance, accommodation and medical assurance and cover the costs.
4. To select scholarship beneficiaries under certain criteria.
5. To negotiate courses with Party B for master and Ph.D scholarship beneficiaries and assist Party A with contract signing with the scholarship beneficiaries.

Article IV Date and Period of Effect

The agreement takes effect on the date of signing and the effect lasts five years.

Article V Applicable Laws and Dispute Resolution

1. The interpretation and operation of the agreement abides by the laws of the People's Republic of China.
2. Disputes shall be resolved through friendly negotiations between the three parties. Where there exist unsettled disputes, the three parties agree to submit the disputes to China International Economic and Trade Arbitration Commission located in Beijing under the laws of the People's Republic of China.

Article VI Text and Copies of the Agreement

The agreement is written in Chinese and English. Both versions have equal legal force.

**Memorandum of Understanding on Student Exchange
between
Visva-Bharati, India and Reitaku University, Japan**

Pursuant to the Agreement for academic cooperation between Visva-Bharati, a Central University and an Institute of National Importance [VB] and Reitaku University [RU], this Memorandum establishes the details of the student exchange program between VB and RU.

1. VB may send one student of the Ph.D. Program in the Japanese Department of VB to the Japanese Language Education Program of the Graduate School of Language Education at RU per academic year. The student must have completed the Ph.D. coursework in VB and have passed the N2 level of the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test. It is ideal that the student has a level of Japanese language proficiency that is equivalent to the N1 level of the Japanese-Language Proficiency Test.
2. The VB student will stay at RU for about four months either in the first semester or in the second semester. If the VB student stays at RU in the first semester, the student must arrive at RU at the end of March before the first semester begins at RU. If the VB student stays at RU in the second semester, the student must arrive at RU in mid-September before the second semester begins at RU.
3. The VB student is required to attend at least seven classes per week at RU to fulfill their visa status.
4. RU will waive its tuition and dormitory fees for the VB student. The VB student is responsible for all other expenses, such as airfare, meals, health insurance, textbooks, continuing tuition charges at VB, and etc.
5. VB will receive a group of students and faculty members from RU for a study tour either in August or February for a week or so. VB will provide them with accommodation at the guesthouse on campus for free. The Japanese Department will coordinate and provide some lectures and opportunities for RU students to learn about Indian culture, society and history, hopefully through interactions with VB students.

VISVA-BHARATI, (a Central University) located at Santiniketan, West Bengal, India (hereinafter referred to as "Visva-Bharati") and **Aoyama Gakuin University, Tokyo, Japan** agree to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for mutual collaboration and enrichment in areas of Students, Faculty and Pedagogic Exchange programmes and sharing of specific expertise possessed by each institution.

Both parties agree:

That the mutual support and cooperation will serve their respective institutional development by increasing its research and technology dissemination and preservation of culture. That this kind of linkage will better serve the needs of the community, recognizing them, as well as issues related to social solidarity, employment and production.

Both Visva-Bharati and **Aoyama Gakuin University** will encourage contact and cooperation between their own faculty members, departments, centers and other affiliated institutes and programmes. This agreement shall enable the two institutes to enter into working relationship with each other, subject to the following provisions:

I. PURPOSE

In recognition of the proven value, both personal and educational, of the international exchange for students, staff and faculty, we herewith establish, at the institutional level, the principles, policy guidelines and procedures required to facilitate such exchange between our institutions.

II. OBJECTIVES

The objective of this agreement is to encourage international cooperation and exchange between the two institutions in the following areas:

- a) Exchange of students;
- b) Exchange of faculty members and supporting staff;
- c) Promotion of lectures, workshops and exhibitions;
- d) Setting up of combined projects;
- e) Exchange of information and academic publications.

III. SCOPE

The Agreement between Visva-Bharati and Aoyama Gakuin University covers the exchange and cooperation between the two institutions.

IV. EXCHANGE OF STUDENTS

A. Reciprocal Exchange

1. Student exchanges are based on the principle of reciprocity; ideally within the same academic year and for the same period of time.
2. The number of students exchanged under this Agreement will be settled each year mutually by Visva-Bharati and Aoyama Gakuin University.
3. The exchange-student will be nominated by the home institution which is subject to acceptance by the host institution. Each exchange-student will satisfy the admission procedures and requirements of the host department as well as the prerequisites for specific courses and programmes. Language proficiency of exchange-students will be verified by the home institution.
4. Exchange-students will be admitted in a non-degree status by the host institution for a period of one semester or two semesters and for a maximum of one academic year.
5. Exchange-students may take courses for credit and the host institution will issue a transcript and grades for exchange-students under the same rules and regulations as for its degree students.
6. Exchange-students may pursue collaborative research (Ph.D. / Research Projects/ Dissertation) between the two institutions for academic enrichment leading to increased understanding between the institutions and their respective countries.
7. As long as the principle of reciprocity is maintained, Aoyama Gakuin University, Tokyo and Visva-Bharati, Santiniketan agree to waive tuition fees for such exchange-students.
8. The expenditure related to local hospitality (boarding/lodging, and internal transport) will be borne by the candidate. The travel cost will be borne by the concerned student or through an external funding. The student shall bear their cost for meals, health insurance, semester contribution (at their home institution), medical costs, passport and visa costs, course materials (books and consumables) and other expenses.

9. Exchange-students must carry medical health insurance that meets the requirements of the host institution and/or the host government. Neither institution will incur liability for illness, injury, financial loss or death of an exchange-student at the partner institution. Both institutions will ensure that exchange-students sign liability waivers absolving both institutions of liability.
10. If one member of an exchange group withdraws before the end of the designated period of that exchange, the status of the other members of the exchange group will not be affected.
11. The host institution will provide assistance in adjusting to the academic, social and cultural life of the host institution and community. It will also provide instruction, academic evaluation and supervision for exchange-students as is maintained for home students.
12. Exchange-students are expected to adhere to the rules and regulations of the host institution and respect the cultural mores, national traditions and customs of the host country.

B. Projects

Special arrangements for groups of students and teacher(s) from one institution to another for the purpose of a short-term visit (projects, workshops, exhibitions) will be possible. Details about each project will be determined separately and arrangements will be made according to the needs.

V. EXCHANGE OF FACULTY

Teaching exchange (if possible and desired)

1. All teaching exchanges are based on the principle of reciprocity within the same academic year, each institution may nominate one of its faculty members to participate in an exchange for the purpose of teaching or research.
2. The participation is subject to approval by the host institution.
3. The period of exchange will normally be one or two semesters and for a maximum period of one academic year.
4. Faculty member on teaching exchanges will remain on full salary and benefits to be paid by their respective institutions. Travel and living expenses for faculty on teaching exchanges shall be subject to prior negotiation and agreement.

5. Teaching course-loads and working hours and conditions will normally be in accordance with established rules and practices of the host institution, subject to prior negotiation and agreement.
6. Remuneration for special projects is subject to special negotiation with the home institution.
7. The host institution will give access to libraries to faculty members on teaching exchange.
8. Faculty members on teaching exchange must carry medical health insurance that meets the requirements of the host institution and/or host government.
9. The host institution will assist in finding accommodation and help in adjusting to the academic, social and cultural life of the host institution and community. The cost of accommodation will have to be borne by the concerned faculty member.

A Visiting Scholars

1. Visiting scholars from both institutions may, at the request or with the approval of the host institution, visit the partner institution for the purpose of research, consultation and short-term teaching; subject to prior negotiation.
2. Travel and living expenses for visiting scholars will not be paid by the host institution, unless specific arrangements are made and agreed upon in advance.
3. Visiting scholars must carry medical health insurance that meets the requirements of the host institution and/or host government.
4. The host institution will assist in finding accommodation and help in adjusting to the academic, social and cultural life of the host institution and community. The cost of accommodation will have to be borne by the concerned visiting scholar.

VI. DURATION, CONDITIONS AND MODIFICATIONS OF THE AGREEMENT


1. This agreement becomes effective upon the signature of the designated officials of both institutions. Its actual implementation will begin as soon as both institutions have identified qualified individuals in each institution ready to participate in the exchange.
2. This Agreement is valid for five years from the date of signature. However, after three years a midterm evaluation will be held. This will be the moment to check the balance of number of exchange of students and staff in the past three years. This will also be a moment to discuss points of improvement or adjustments from both the signing institutions.

3. The absence of exchanges during one academic year is possible and does not nullify the Agreement.
4. In accordance with the Equal Opportunity Policies of the institutions named above, there will be no discrimination against any person, for any reason, who is qualified as a participant in the programme supported by this document.
5. Either institution may terminate this Agreement with a notice of six months. Exchanges in progress at the time remain unaffected and will be completed within the agreed period.
6. Modifications may be proposed and implemented at any time, effective from the date of written notification signed by both institutions.
7. At the end of the penultimate year of the five-year cycle both institutions will conduct an evaluation of the programme. Any amendments to be made should be achieved by mutual consent and the Agreement may be re-affirmed accordingly for a further five-years.

I. PURPOSE

In recognition of the proven value, both personal and educational, of the international exchange for students, staff and faculty, we herewith establish, at the institutional level, the principles, policy guidelines and procedures required to facilitate such exchange between our institutions.

II. OBJECTIVE

The objective of this agreement is to encourage international cooperation and exchange between the two institutions in the following areas:

- a) Exchange of students
- b) Exchange of faculty members and supporting staff
- c) Promotion of lectures, workshops and exhibitions
- d) Setting up of combined projects
- e) Exchange of information and academic publications

III. SCOPE

The Agreement between Visva-Bharati, Shantiniketan, India and Royal Academy of Art The Hague covers the exchange between the two institutions.

IV. EXCHANGE OF STUDENTS

A. Reciprocal Exchange

1. Student exchanges are based on the principle of reciprocity; ideally within the same academic year and for the same period of time.
2. The number of students exchanged under this Agreement is tentatively limited to no more than two per year.
3. The exchange students will be nominated by the home institution; the application is subject to acceptance by the host institution. Each exchange student will satisfy the admission procedures and requirements of the host department as well as the prerequisites for specific courses and programmes. The exchange student must have successfully completed two years of his degree course at the home institution. All applications should be submitted before the deadline.
4. Language proficiency of exchange students will be gauged and verified by appropriate personnel at the home institution.
5. Exchange students will be admitted in a non-degree status by the host institution for a period of one semester.
6. Exchange students may take courses for credit and the host institution will issue a transcript of records for exchange students under the same rules and regulations as for its degree students.
7. As long as the principle of reciprocity is maintained, Royal Academy of Art The Hague and Visva-Bharati, Santiniketan agree to waive tuition fees for exchange.
8. Students are responsible for all travel costs, accommodation, meals, health insurance, liability insurance, semester contribution (at their home institution), medical costs, passport and visa costs, course materials (books, and consumables) and other expenses. The host institution will not provide financial assistance to exchange students.

9. Exchange students must carry medical health insurance and liability insurance that meet the requirements of the host institution and/or the host government. Neither institution will incur liability for illness, injury, financial loss or death of an exchange student at the partner institution. Both institutions will ensure that exchange students sign liability waivers absolving both institutions of liability.
10. If one member of an exchange withdraws before the end of the designated period of that exchange, the status of the other member of the exchange will not be affected. The principle of reciprocity however, must be maintained over time.
11. The host institution will provide information to exchange students in locating accommodation and provide assistance in adjusting to the academic, social and cultural life of the host institution and community. It will also provide instruction, academic evaluation and supervision for exchange students as is maintained for home students.
12. Exchange students are expected to adhere to the rules and regulations of the host institution and respect the cultural mores, national traditions and customs of the host country.

B. Projects

Special arrangements for groups of students and teacher(s) from one institution to another for the purpose of a short-term visit (projects, workshops, exhibitions) will be possible. Details about each project will be determined separately and arrangements will be made according to the needs.

V. EXCHANGE OF PROFESSORS

Teaching exchange (if possible and desired)

1. All teaching exchanges are based on the principle of reciprocity within the same academic year and each institution may nominate one of its professors to participate in an exchange for the purpose of teaching or research.
2. The participants are subject to approval by the host institution.
3. The period of exchange will normally be at maximum one week.
4. Professors on teaching exchanges will remain on full salary and benefits with their respective institutions. Travel and living expenses for professors on teaching exchanges are not compensated by the host institution.
5. Teaching course loads and working hours and conditions will normally be in accordance with established rules and practices of the host institution, subject to prior negotiation and agreement.
6. The host institution will provide office space and will give access to libraries and other needed facilities for professors on teaching exchange.
7. Professors on teaching exchange must carry medical health insurance and liability insurance that meet the requirements of the host institution and/or host government.
8. The host institution will provide services to assist exchange professors in locating accommodation and adjusting to the academic, social and cultural life of the host institution and community.

1. This agreement becomes effective upon the signature of the designated officials of both institutions. Its actual implementation will begin as soon as both institutions have identified qualified individuals in each institution ready to participate in the exchange.

Article 1 - INTENTION OF BOTH PARTS

Visva-Bharati University (Kala Bhavana) and Esba TALM have decided to set up an exchange programme between their two structures.

The objective is to facilitate the admission of students of both structures to the courses of the partner structure. It will enable, if necessary, exchanges of teachers.

Both partners decide, by mutual agreement, of the number of students that will take part in the exchange program each academic year. **This number can go up to a maximum of 8 students each year, with a maximum of 4 students per semester.**

Esba TALM is the structure that gathers the 3 fine arts schools of the cities of Tours, Angers and Le Mans in France. Both parts agree that Esba TALM students can come from any of the 3 campuses, that is to say from Tours, Angers or Le Mans. Moreover, students from Visva-Bharati University will be able to indicate their preference regarding the campus where they would like to make their study period, according to the specific specializations and courses offered by each campus. However, Esba TALM can give its advice to direct a student from Visva-Bharati University to one campus among the 3, in agreement with Visva-Bharati University for each specific case.

Article 2 - PURPOSE OF THE AGREEMENT

The students who want to apply for an exchange programme will be pre-selected by their home structure, and candidates shall be proposed by each institution. It will mainly concern students that have validated 3 years of study in fine arts/design and that are in their 4th year.

An exchange of visual documents shall accompany the propositions.

The receiving structure will be able to turn down a candidate if the conditions are not met. In case of acceptance, the receiving structure will confirm its agreement in writing, especially in order to enable the student to get a visa for his/her trip and for his/her study period.

Article 3 – LENGTH OF THE STUDY PERIOD

Both partners will accept students for a study period of a semester (of a minimum of 3 months). The agreement for a semester may be extended up to one year maximum (two semesters), with the approval of both structures.

Article 4 – SCHOOL FEES AND ASSISTANCE

The students of both structures who participate in an exchange programme pay the school fees, and all associated fees, to their school of origin. They are entitled to a complete exemption of the subscription and school fees in the receiving institution.

However, every other personal expenses (including transport, travel, accommodation, food expenses, as well as material and equipment/school stationery expenses, documentation expenses, and paying courses of language) are payable by students.

Both institutions are committed to do their best to help visiting students find accommodation in the host city during their study period, by giving students all necessary information and contacts.

Article 5 – STUDIO SPACE AND FACILITIES

They also agree to provide studio space for the visiting students to work in the host institution during their study period. The students will have the same access to the studio spaces as the local students. At Esba TALM, different spaces are available for students, where each one can find his/her own, depending on his/her works and practices (painting, sculpture, media art, design works...) and the materials used.

Moreover, visiting students have access to the workshops, facilities and equipment of the receiving institution, which enable all students to use the technical and technological means appropriate to their options and art practices.

Article 6 – SUPERVISION AND GUIDANCE



Both institutions agree to train, assess, and supervise exchange students in the same conditions as their own students.

Both institutions commit to communicate the student's marks/credits just after the study period, and any observations about any unsatisfactory behaviour of a student. In case of a serious problem, the receiving institution can take any measure, including the expulsion of a student to his/her school of origin, after informing the latter.

The receiving school, depending on its means, will provide some help to the exchange student so that he/she can find an accomodation and can integrate with school life.

Article 7 – INSURANCE COVERAGE AND LIABILITY

Before their departure to the partner school, each structure must ensure that the selected students have subscribed to an insurance which covers their medical expenses, the expenses in case of an accident and a repatriation, and which covers them during their whole stay in the receiving country, before they leave their country of origin. Students will have to give to the receiving institution a certificate of this insurance.

Article 8 – VALIDITY OF THE AGREEMENT

This agreement is valid after it is signed by both parties, for a length of 3 years. It is renewable by express renewal, for an identical period.

It can be annually revised. Every modification in the terms of the agreement must be negotiated and accepted in writting by both structures.

This agreement can be broken if one of the institution demands it in writting to the other institution, and if it warns the other by a registered letter with acknowledgement of receipt.

The breach of contract cannot have the consequence to interrupt the projects of the current academic year.



19. It is important that the information and knowledge generated through the use of these funds are made publicly available as soon as possible. In order to achieve the aforementioned objectives, each institution is encouraged to set up its own inter-operable institutional open access repository ("IR") for its research papers and review articles published in peer-reviewed journals. The Ministry of Science and Technology has set up a central harvester (www.sciencecentral.in) that will harvest the full text and metadata of these publications. Kindly update the findings accordingly.

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as MoU) is made on this 19th day of **December, 2017** by and between the **National Rice Research Institute** having its Head Office at **Cuttack** hereinafter called "ICAR-NRRI" as [First party], a constituent Research Institution of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi-110 001 on the ONE PART and the **Visva-Bharati, (A Central University) Santiniketan, West Bengal** [hereinafter called "Visva-Bharati, (A Central University)"] as [Second party] on the OTHER PART (who for the purpose of this MoU are hereinafter collectively referred to as the parties).

The parties, having discussed fields of common research interests and allied activities between the two institutions, have decided to enter into collaboration in post graduate/doctorate research in the field of agriculture for promotion of students' training and quality research in cutting edge areas in accordance with the provisions contained in the Guidelines issued *vide* Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or as revised from time to time.

WHEREAS the "First Party" is involved in the studies on Rice Research AND WHEREAS the "Second Party", established by Govt. of India *vide* Act No. 29 of 1951 (The Visva-Bharati Act, 1951) is involved in agriculture science research.

1. Scope

1.1 The Second party will recognize the First party as an Institute for conducting research related to the thesis requirement of the research students for Post Graduate/Doctorate Research. The Second party will recognize Scientists of the NRRI as recommended by its Director in accordance with the University rules and regulations for guiding students working for the said degree.

1.2 Operational details of research effort and collaboration will be made in common research programmes and/or projects restricted to specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/divisions. The objective(s) for research work for a student coming from a Second party outside NARS should be exclusively different as far as possible.

1.3 Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with the First party and the Second party will be made available to the faculty and research scholars. However, the costs of specific consumables will be borne by the respective organizations.

1.4 Accommodation in the Hostel by the first party shall be arranged, wherever possible, as per extant rates. The duration of exchange visits will be determined by mutual consent between both the parties.

2. Management

2.1 Director of the First party and the Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party will be responsible to work out operational details of co-operation between the two organizations and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MoU.

2.2 The Advisory Committee will meet at least once in a year alternatively in the institutions of the First party and the Second party to review the activities. This meeting shall include presentation on the academic and research activities, which should be open to the students, faculty and scientists.

3. Exchange of Information

3.1. The term "information" includes scientific or technical data, results and/or methods of investigation, and other information intended to be provided, exchanged, or arising under project descriptions entered into pursuant to this MoU.

3.2. The parties support the widest possible dissemination of information. Each party in joint projects shall be given the right to use, disclose, publish or disseminate such information for any and all purposes.

4. General Provisions

4.1 It is understood that the First party and the Second party subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, caste or religion. Both the Institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students, which violate principles of non-discrimination.

4.2 Both parties understand that all financial agreements will have to be negotiated separately and will depend on the availability of funds.

4.3 Any research publications arising will be jointly published in accordance with the provisions laid out in Item 3.2.1C of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programme as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified *vide* Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time.

4.4 A copy of the thesis/dissertation will be submitted to the First Party after the award of the degree by the Second party.

4.5 All questions related to this MoU arising during its term will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. Disagreements at the operating level shall be forwarded to respective higher officials for appropriate resolution failing which an arbitrator of mutual acceptance may be identified for the settlement of dispute, if any.

4.6 All questions not foreseen related to this MoU will be handled by the parties by mutual agreement.

4.7 Nothing in this MoU is intended to affect other cooperation or collaborations between the parties.

5. Intellectual Property Rights

5.1 The Second party will be expected to ensure protection of the Intellectual Property Rights generated or likely to be generated during the student's research work. The ICAR–National Rice Research Institute as the first applicant and the Second party shall be the joint applicants for IPRs and the students and involved scientific staff shall be included as the inventor/breeder/author.

5.2 The 'ICAR Guidelines for Intellectual Property Management and Technology Transfer/Commercialization' as amended from time to time shall be the reference for exploitation of the generated intellectual property, whose management and benefits sharing shall be mutually decided in each case.

6. Admission and Fees

6.1 All those who wish to register as trainees or for Master/Doctoral programme under this MoU must apply for admission at the Second party. The allocation of Major Guide/Advisor would be finalized before the registration and will be governed by the provisions laid out in Items 3.2.1A and 3.2.2A of the Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions as notified *vide* Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time, for the students from within NARS and outside NARS, respectively.

6.2 Admission of the students and the award of degrees for different programmes will be the responsibility of the Second party as per the rules and regulations.

6.3 Allotment of the students at the First party will be done by the approval of Director of the First party and Vice-Chancellor/Head of the Institution of the Second party.

6.4 The First party would have the right to screen the student's eligibility for admission based on their academic period.

6.5 The PME Cell of the First party in consultation with the representative of the Second party shall decide the location and sharing quantum of research work.

6.6 The number of student(s) at any particular time will be subjected to the availability of research facilities and scientists' time to guide thesis research at the First party institution.

6.7 Any student(s) admitted to the First party for training/postgraduate research, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the First party or indulge in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of the Institute, or cause damage to the property, the registration of such student(s) would be summarily terminated. The Second party will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the losses to the First party.

6.8 Fees will be charged from the students by the First party as per Guidelines for the students to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at ICAR institutions *vide* Letter No. 2-8/2012-HRD dated 11th December, 2012 or revised Guidelines, if any, as may be issued from time to time. No fee may be charged by the First party from the students registered with AU/DU within NARS. However a student registered with a Second party, outside NARS, will deposit fee of Rs. 10,000/- for training duration of 3 months (not leading to a degree/dissertation) and Rs. 30,000/- per semester (six months) for training, research, dissertation exceeding three months.

Any change in fee structure by ICAR will be applicable from the date of revision and shall be charged by the First party.

7. Entry into effect, modification and termination

7.1 This MoU shall become effective on the date it is signed by the parties and shall be valid for **three years** and extendable up to five years. Both parties shall review the status of the MoU at the end of each three year period to determine any modification, whenever necessary. The period of validity of this MoU may be extended by mutual consent up to five years. This MoU may be amended by mutual written agreement and may be terminated at any time by either party upon written notification signed by the competent authority of the party initiating termination. Such notification must be given to the other party at least six months in advance from the effective date of termination.


7.2 All joint activities not completed at the expiration or termination of the MoU may be continued until their completion under the terms of this MoU.



VISVA-BHARATI, a Central University located at Santiniketan, West Bengal, India (hereinafter referred to as "Visva-Bharati") and Indira Kala Sangeet Vishwavidyalaya, Khairagarh, Chhattisgarh (**Name and location of the partner institute**) agree to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for mutual collaboration and enrichment in areas of Students, Faculty and Pedagogic Exchange programmes and sharing of specific expertise possessed by each institution;

Both parties agree:

That the mutual support and cooperation will serve their respective institutional development by increasing its research and technology dissemination

and preservation of culture. That this kind of linkage will better serve the needs of the community, recognizing them, as well as issues related to social solidarity, employment and production.

Both Dept. of H.C.M., Visva-Bharati and I.K.S.V. (**Name of the partner institute**) will encourage contact and cooperation between their own faculty members, departments, centres and other affiliated institutes and programmes. This agreement shall enable the two institutes to enter into working relationship with each other, subject to the following provisions;

Article 1:

Visva-Bharati shall enter into cooperative arrangements with Indira Kala Sangeet Vishwavidyalaya (**Name of the partner institute**) in fields of research, teaching and collaboration to be agreed upon. Activities of both the institutions would include but not be restricted to:

- a) Joint research activity developed through the research linkages of individual faculty members;
- b) Exchange of faculty members, graduate and undergraduate students for research and studies specially in the field of classical music (required subject). Development of professional and continuing education courses and programmes to benefit students and faculties;
- c) Exchange of scholars for lectures, talks, conferences, colloquia & symposia.

Article 2:

- a) Both the institutions will agree to encourage the exchange of students between them.

- b) Encourage students to jointly compete and participate in the internationally financed programmes.
- c) Encourage the participation of students of both the institutions in students' conferences and fairs.
- d) Support the participation of students of the partner institution in cultural and other activities.

Article 3:

Both the Universities may agree to a collaborative search for external funding to support activities related to publishing activities and exchange may be explored.

- a) In order to rationalize publishing activities the partner institutions may agree to jointly publish text-books and other lecturing material whose authors are the professors and researchers of the two institutions.
- b) Enable their professors and associates to publish their articles and papers in the partner faculty's/University's publications.
- c) Jointly publish collected works from mutually organized conferences or from the conferences on which they jointly participated.
- d) Both Universities agree that exchanges may take place in all disciplines and specialties of each one of them as mutually agreed.

Article 4:

In case of exchange programme:-

- a) The expenditure related to local hospitality (boarding, lodging and internal transport) will be borne by the host institution. The travel

cost will be borne by the parent institution of the concerned scholar/faculty.

- b) The institutions will encourage members of their faculty to undertake short visits, or to take up fixed-term visiting assignments (semesters) at each other's institution.

Article 5:

Wherever practical the two institutions will endeavour to involve any other institution which can contribute to the mutual field of interest.

Article 6:

It is implied that the two institutions will subscribe to the principle of equal opportunities and will not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, ethnicity, religion or national origin. Both the institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither institution shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students which would violate the principles of non discrimination.

Article 7:

This agreement will be effective for a period of five (5) years which may be extended by the mutual consent of the two institutions.

Article 8:



Given that this agreement represents a totally voluntary endeavour by both parties, it may be amended by the mutual agreement of both parties or it may be terminated by either upon a prior notification in writing to the other party of not less than twelve (12) months. Any termination of the agreement should not affect the ongoing projects.

Article 9:

No damages can be claimed by either of the party for non-fulfilment of conditions of memorandum of understanding.

NB Institute for Rural Technology, a Society registered under the Society Act and other relevant laws of India and having its office at 220, Madurdaha, Kolkata 700107 with registered office at 52, Sakuntala Road, Agartala 799001 (hereinafter referred to as "NBIRT").

Referred to as, individually, the "Party" or, collectively, the "Parties".

VBU is partnering with NBIRT to execute the Project outlined in Department of Science and Technology, GOI Sanction Order no. DST/TMD/MI/OGMI/2018/14 (C) and the Scope of Work outlined under the same order. DST has released separate funds against VBU & NBIRT based on the scope of works of the individual Institutes. The total amount will be transferred to the account of VBU from which VBU will release the funds of NBIRT as per the sanction order.

The Objectives of this project are as follows:

1. Enhancement of the Capacity Utilization Factor (CUF) of a small hydro power plant via battery-less storage of solar energy to operate pumps to maintain constant water levels in its upper reservoir.

III. Possibility of scaling up in other areas where a perennial river source is unavailable.

IV. Upliftment of quality of life for individuals as well as community as a whole and the Environment of that area.

Article 1:


VBU and NBIRT are partnering to execute the project entitled "Development, Research and Pilot Scale Installation of Solar-Hydro Pumped Storage scheme in a remote Village of Assam to ensure 24x7 electricity where the scope of work for the two Institutions are defined as follows:

VBU:

1. Conducting Baseline survey about the socio-economic status of the village.
2. Women empowerment through training for increasing socio-economic activity for banana stem fiber, broom making, Super leaf plates making, preparation of orange jelly, jam & squash and bamboo handicraft.
3. Enhancing the thread winding by mechanization of the process using electricity.
4. Education upliftment by strengthening the Anganwadi pre-school children under ICDS programme and providing coaching to the on-going school children who are less gifted learners/slow learners. This will improve the overall educational quality of the area.
5. To improve the health and hygiene of the individual and the community, solar water purifier system will be provided. A community kitchen concept will be adopted, so that every child can get a better nutrition and thereby reduce malnutrition substantially.
6. Formation of Self Help Groups along with thrift savings will be introduced to the women folk.
7. The Self Help Groups will ultimately be linked with local banks to get subsidized bank loans for the entire operation of the project and ensure sustainable rural development by effective participation and management of the community.
8. Scientific survey to check the water and soil quality for prevention of water borne disease and for agriculture respectively, because from the basic survey it has been observed that water borne disease such as typhoid, dysentery, diarrhoea are very common in that very area (Quality of environment will be monitored).

NBIRT:

1. Basic Survey work on the water flow system in the Upper killing river along with Study of the catchment discharge data.
2. Study of seasonal operation of the Micro Hydel Plant and simulation of System.
3. Survey of Village Load.



5. The master controller shall be designed and fabricated for sequential operation of the Solar pumps based on water requirement based on sensor data
6. The proposed Solar power plant shall be installed along with installation of Solar pumps.
7. A synch panel shall be developed for integrating the Micro Hydel with the Weak Grid and Solar Power.
8. Training of the selected people from the local community will be conducted on Operation of the Plant.
9. Performance monitoring of the system by operation under various perennial conditions and by the operator will be done. Evaluation of the performance will be carried out by NBIRT.

The project summary and sanction letter from the DST is attached.

In this context, the parties wish to take forward and formalise a partnership to execute this initial phase of the collaboration and fulfil their respective roles and obligations towards the same. The key terms are detailed below.

Article 2:

Timelines: As per DST Sanction Order: DST/TMD/MI/OGML/2018/14 (C)

Article 3:

Payment and mode of payment: VBU will transfer the funds as per the sanction order issued by Department of Science and Technology, Government of India from time to time to NBIRT. It becomes mandatory on part of NBIRT to utilise grants so transferred from VBU as provisions of GFR 17 as mentioned in the sanction order.

Article 4:

Quality: NBIRT and VBU will be responsible for quality execution of the Project work related to the scope of work of each Institution.

Article 5:

Termination: This MOU shall be terminated with the completion of the Project tenure.

Article 6:


Sub-Contract: NBIRT may sub contract or outsource some part of the work as and when necessary.

Intellectual Property: Both NBIRT & VB may apply for patent independently or jointly if needed.

Article 8:

Disputes and Arbitration: In case of any disputes, the issue will be settled mutually. However, both the parties shall be guided by the terms and conditions of the sanction order No. DST/TMD/MI/OGML/2018/14 (C) of DST, GOI



Article 10:

Duration of the Project: 2 years from the date of receipt of fund by VBU

Article 11:

Submission of Reports: NBIRT will submit Progress Report of the work to VBU as per DST format as and when required. VBU will submit compiled progress report to DST, GOI as per norms.

Article 12:

Presentation and Meetings: NBIRT will join with VBU during any presentation to be made before DST or Expert Committee or as directed. Meetings will be held at VBU, NBIRT and Sheffield University, UK (MI Country). International travel will be borne by the project fund.


Article 13:



VISVA-BHARATI, a Central University located at Santiniketan, West Bengal, India (hereinafter referred to as “Visva-Bharati”) and BIHAR HERITAGE DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY, An Autonomous Organization under the Department of Art, Culture & Youth Affairs, Govt. of Bihar, agree to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for mutual collaboration and enrichment in area respective expertise for the benefit of students and faculty members the University and staff members of the Collaborative institution.

Both Parties agree:

That the mutual support and cooperation will serve their respective institutional development by increasing its research and providing site training in field archaeology. Bihar Heritage Development Society will provide the necessary finance for the excavations and explorations (Local hospitality, local travel and technical expanses during the courses of archaeological explorations and excavations at Lakhisarai and surrounding area) Visva-Bharati faculty members will provide technical support without any remuneration. Visva-Bharati will bear the cost of travelling by training for its student and staff members up to the site as per rules.

Both Visva-Bharati and Bihar Heritage Development Society will encourage contact and cooperation between both the institutions. This agreement shall enable the two institutes to enter working relationship with each other, subject to the following provisions;

Article 1:

- (c) Exchange of scholars for lectures, talks, conference, colloquia and symposia.

Article 2:

- (a) Both the institutions will agree to encourage the exchange of students, and research personnel.
- (b) Support the participation of the research personnel in academic activities.

Article 3:

- (a) Reports of archaeological field work and excavations will be published by Bihar Heritage Development Society under joint authorship. Copy right of the report will vest with Bihar Heritage Development Society. Names of the contributors and the researchers will be clearly mentioned in all the publications.
- (b) Members of the team will be encouraged to publish scientific articles individually after the publication of excavation of report under the intimation to both the institution.
- (c) Bihar Heritage Development Society will arrange for the publication of the field report and bear all the expenses towards its publication, editing and printing.

Article 4:

Whenever practical the two institutions will endeavour to involve any other institution which can contribute to the mutual field of interest.

Article 5:

This agreement will be effective for a period of five (5) years which may be extended by the mutual consent of the two institutions.

Article 6:





Article 2:

- a) In order to rationalise publishing activities the partner institutions may agree to jointly publish text-books and other lecturing material whose authors are the professors and researchers of the two institutions.
- b) Enable their professors and associates to publish their articles and papers in the partner faculty's/University's publications.
- c) Jointly publish collected works from mutually organised conferences or from the conferences on which they jointly participated.
- d) Both Universities agree that exchanges may take place in all disciplines and specialties of each one of them as mutually agreed.

Article 4:

In case of exchange programme:-

- a) The expenditure related to local hospitality (boarding, lodging and internal transport) will be borne by the host institution. The travel cost will be borne by the parent institution of the concerned scholar/faculty.
- b) The institutions will encourage members of their faculty to undertake short visits, or to take up fixed-term visiting assignments (semesters) at each other's institution.

Article 5:

Wherever practical the two institutions will endeavour to involve any other institution which can contribute to the mutual field of interest.

Article 6: It is implied that the two institutions will subscribe to the principle of equal opportunities and will not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age,




