<u>Programme Objectives:</u> Assamese Department of Bhasha-Bhavana offers 5 years Ph. D Course in Assamese Language, Literature and Culture, Language and Literature of North-East India and Comparative Study of Literature and Language. The medium of the thesis is Assamese or English.

<u>Course Objectives:</u> The Ph. D Course Work in Assamese has been intended to make the researchers involved for any type of linguistic, literary and cultural or comparative study related to Assam or North-East India, Assamese language, literature and culture, to familiarize students with basics of research and the research process, to enable the participants in conducting research work and formulating research synopsis and report, to familiarize participants with field work, data collection, statistical techniques and interpretation of results, to impart knowledge for enabling students to develop data analytics skills and meaningful interpretation to the data sets so as to solve the research problem.

Besides research and research methodology & techniques in Course-I, four elective courses in four units have been offered through Course-II as follows-

Unit-1: Language Studies, Languages of India, North East India & Assam,

Unit-2: Literary Studies, Comparative Literature, Textual Criticism,

Unit-3: Folklore and Cultural Studies.

Unit-4: North East India Studies.

Internal assessment, synopsis writing, literature review, presentation, oral interactions occur in third evaluation for completion of the course. 2 three hour written papers of 100 marks each of which 20% will be allotted by internal assessment.

Learning Outcome: Upon successful completion of the course participants are expected to develop understanding on various kinds of research, objectives of doing research, research process, research designs and sampling, have basic knowledge on qualitative and quantitative research techniques, have basic awareness of analysis and presentation of data.
